Holly Hanson attended the meeting to give the villages an update on ongoing and new issues:

- Community “Village Meadow” is in progress, the meadow has been sown and the seed is growing. 420 trees are expected in March (Mixture of woodland & native fruit trees) will require assistance from the village in March to plant out
- Blocked drain at 34 Main Street, it is still blocked and is on-going, no further developments.
- Extraordinary meeting in the village has been organised for 18th December over developments at the Haymaker pub site.

4: Zoe Harris – Natwest Bank Community Banker

Zoe Harris attended the meeting to discuss money scams and to give advice and impartial advice on how to stay safe She explained the difference between fraud and scamming:

Fraud – Your details are stolen against your knowledge such as websites or skimming devices

Scams – You are tricked into giving your details to the scammers

- 43% are over 65, who are scammed
- Costs the economy 5-10 billion
- It is the Humberside Police Service’s biggest issue and crime beating drugs
- Types of scams are postal, telephone, doorstep and email
- Once you have been scammed your details are sold on the black market repeatedly
- If you have been scammed, you will receive lots of junk mail
- Young people are also being targeted by identify theft, money mules or fake job adverts
- If in doubt about a phone call, email, letter do not reply and never make contact using these details given
- If via telephone always hang up and to check the caller out use another device as scammers can stay on the telephone line
